

# AD/HD & FASD:

What's the relationship & what are the implications for treatment?

**Description:** **Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD)** comes in many forms, some of which seem to defy treatment. The different types of AD/HD will be explored in this workshop, with emphasis on the more complex patterns of this condition. Participants will learn how prenatal exposure can produce the symptoms of AD/HD, and the complications surrounding treatment. Participants will learn to develop a treatment plan addressing the array of difficulties presented with **Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD)**, including the symptoms of AD/HD. Participants will receive tools to help with screening, conceptualizing and treating this often-baffling condition.
